


Household By Type




# Storm Lake Demographics



■ Hispanic ■ White ■ Asian ■ Pacific Islander ■ Black


### STORM LAKE COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT DEMOGRAPHICS

Languages Spoken




- 48% of Storm Lake residents speak English, while 51% speak other languages. The non-English language spoken by most residents in Storm Lake is Spanish by 33%.


## Storm Lake Police Budget 2021

# Complaints of Misconduct

The goal of the Storm Lake Police Department is to respond fairly and effectively to allegations of employee misconduct. Integrity and honesty are paramount to the policing profession, and it is expected of all members of the Storm Lake Police Department. A proper relationship fostered by confidence and trust between the Storm Lake Police Department and the citizens and visitors of the City of Storm Lake is essential to effective law enforcement.

Personnel complaints against department officers can originate from inside or outside the department. A complaint can be a report of wrongdoing or inappropriate action on the part of any employee of the Storm Lake Police Department.

When a person has a complaint against a police department employee (sworn or civilian), the complaint may be filed in person, by telephone at 712-732-8010, or by completing a citizen commendation / complaint form and sending it to the Chief of Police. This form is available in person at the Storm Lake Police Department or by request by emailing [slpd@stormlake.org](mailto:slpd@stormlake.org).

When a person files a complaint, it may be considered a formal or informal complaint. Informal complaints are minor in nature and can be resolved without a formal process and may be referred to the employee's supervisors. The supervisor will investigate the complaint, communicate with the initial caller, and identify a resolution to the complaint. Formal complaints will be presented to the City Manager and Chief of Police, who will appoint an investigator to conduct a complete investigation of the complaint filed. The findings of the investigation will be reported to the City Manager and Civil Service Commission when applicable.

In most cases, a supervisor specially trained in these types of investigations will conduct the investigation with the disposition of each case being reviewed by the Chief of Police.

Whenever possible, the investigation will be concluded within 30 days unless unusual circumstances warrant an extension. The Department will make every effort to keep the complainant advised of the progress of the investigation. Once the investigation is completed, the complainant will be notified.

Allegations of misconduct are thoroughly investigated for three reasons:

**Protection of the Public** - The public has the right to receive fair, efficient, and impartial law enforcement. An informed public must have confidence that its police department honestly and fairly investigates and adjudicates all allegations of misconduct.

**Protection of the Department** - A department is often evaluated and judged by the conduct of its individual employees. It is imperative that the whole organization not be criticized because of the misconduct of a few.

**Protection of the Employee** - Employees must be protected against false or misinformed allegations of misconduct.

In 2021 there were five complaints against a total of seven employees. Four of the complaints resulted in no findings of misconduct. One complaint was sustained.

# Patrol Division

- The Storm Lake Police Department Patrol Division is made up of four Lieutenants and twelve patrol officers. Each Lieutenant oversees a patrol shift consisting of two to three patrol officers and one Community Service Officer. The patrol division is primarily responsible for answering calls for service which include:

- Responding to emergency calls
- Taking criminal complaints
- Enforcing traffic laws
- Addressing quality of life issues
- Investigating vehicular accidents
- Preliminary Investigation of crimes
- Community Policing
- Networking with other service providers
- Enforcing city and state criminal laws









## Patrol Types






# Criminal Investigations Overview

---

- The Storm Lake Police Criminal Investigation Division (CID) provides the highest quality criminal investigations by conducting timely and thorough criminal investigations using advanced investigative techniques and forensic equipment. Motivated only by a search for the truth.
- Detectives Weflen and Nieland will search out and collect all available evidence surrounding each case to exonerate the innocent and substantiate the culpability of the guilty. As professional fact finders, these two detectives will conduct systematic and methodical investigations to determine what findings the evidence supports and will not form conclusions in advance. They recognize their responsibilities to the community they serve and are committed to investigating all criminal allegations in an ethical and impartial manner with sensitivity toward the needs of victims and witnesses.
- The detectives are steadfast in their resolve and will mobilize all available resources to accomplish their mission, despite any obstacles, discouragement, or danger. The Storm Lake Police Departments investigators are dedicated to providing superior investigative services to the citizens of Storm Lake and to preserve the quality of life that our citizens and visitors enjoy.

# Criminal Investigations Functions

- The Criminal Investigation Division, commonly known as CID, provides professional investigative services to the Citizens of Storm Lake. The investigators are responsible for investigating all serious crimes, less serious crimes as assigned or needed and to conduct sensitive or special interest investigations as directed by the Chief or Assistant Chief.
- Detectives primarily investigate felony-level crimes and provide criminal investigative support to the Patrol Division. CID works closely with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies to counter and investigate serious crimes.
- CID conducts a broad spectrum of criminal investigations to include death investigations, serious assaults including sexual assault, robbery, burglary, fraud, computer crimes and drug enforcement.
- Specific functions include:
  - Investigate serious crime - and less serious crimes upon request or as needed
  - Perform drug suppression operations
  - Collect, analyze and disseminate criminal intelligence
  - Liaison with other local, state and Federal investigative agencies/units
  - Liaison with County Attorney, Attorney General, and the United States Attorney's Offices
  - Conduct pre-employment background investigations
  - Conduct missing persons investigations
  - Conduct internal affairs investigations
  - Collect and examine evidence at crime scenes
  - Maintain custody of physical and drug evidence
  - Provide protective services
  - Conduct sensitive or special interest investigations as directed by the Chief of Police.



# Criminal Investigations Highlights


- Due to staff shortages in addition to the continuation of the COVID-19 pandemic, the staffing level of the patrol division was again severely impacted in 2021. This resulted in the criminal investigation division being shifted to patrol duties during a portion of the beginning of the 2021 year in order to maintain effective and timely law enforcement services to our citizens.
- Despite this, the criminal investigation division maintained a high level of service and investigated/assisted a broad range of high-profile incidents, such as:
  1. January 2021 – SLPD received a report that an unknown assailant entered a residence and stabbed a person with a knife causing bodily injuries. Police initiated a response involving an extensive canvas and crime scene investigation. After a lengthy investigation police determined the case to be a false report.
  2. January 2021 – Police were called to a report of a stolen vehicle from a business. Upon arrival police obtained surveillance footage and eventually tracked and located the vehicle abandoned. Shortly after locating the vehicle police responded to multiple reports of burglaries to vehicles. After reviewing additional security footage detectives determined the same suspect was involved. Police ultimately located the suspect on foot and took him into custody on numerous charges including burglary and operating a vehicle without owner's consent.
  3. January 2021 – Police were called to an apartment for a burglary in progress. Officers stopped a suspect vehicle leaving the scene and located stolen property and wanted suspects with felony warrants. As a result, multiple felony burglary charges were filed.
  4. January 2021 – Two suspects were arrested after stealing and forging checks on a victim's account totaling nearly twenty thousand dollars in losses. The two suspects were charged with on-going criminal conduct and felony theft.
  5. January 2021 – A suspect was arrested after a several month-long drug investigations in late 2020 involving multiple sales of methamphetamine to an informant. The suspect was charged with on going criminal conduct and felony delivery of a controlled substance.
  6. February 2021 – Police attempted to stop a vehicle driven by a wanted subject. The driver fled and led police on a chase through Buena Vista County and ultimately back into Storm Lake. During the chase, the driver intentionally struck a police vehicle and ultimately was stopped. Police took the suspect into custody and located a firearm within the vehicle. The driver was charged with numerous traffic and weapons violations.
  7. February 2021 – Police stopped a suspect wanted on a warrant charging the suspect with felon in possession of firearm from a traffic stop in late 2020 where the suspect possessed marijuana, a loaded handgun and a rifle in his vehicle. During the stop police arrested the driver on the warrant and subsequently searched the suspects car again, again locating drug paraphernalia and another loaded handgun. The suspect was subsequently charged a second time for possession of firearm as a felon and numerous drug charges.
  8. March 2021 – Police were called to a hotel in Storm Lake for a disputed room charge. After speaking with occupants, they alleged a suspect had attempted to rent the room in exchange for sex from some of the occupants, who were minors. Following a lengthy investigation police arrested a male suspect on charges of prostitution and supplying alcohol to minors.
  9. March 2021 – Police conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. The officer found an occupant to be wanted on multiple felony warrants. Following a K9 search, police located marijuana, prescription drugs, and two loaded handguns (one stolen) in the vehicle. The three occupants were arrested on multiple weapons and drug charges.


10. March 2021 – Police and BVRMC paramedics were called to a hit and run accident near the Storm Lake High School. Police found a fifteen-year-old female who appeared to have been struck and run over by a vehicle, which then fled the scene. The juvenile was transported by ambulance with suspected serious injuries. An investigation ensued, and within 30 minutes police located a suspect vehicle. Police allege the driver was intoxicated and had a loaded handgun in the vehicle. The driver was charged with serious injury by vehicle, OWI, and multiple weapon and traffic charges.
11. March 2021 – Police stopped a vehicle for a minor traffic violation. Police subsequently found the driver to have a barred driving status and be intoxicated. After taking the suspect into custody a K9 search was conducted, leading police to recover a rifle, ammunition and methamphetamine. Police subsequently learned the suspect was a convicted felon. This led to an extensive investigation on the suspect, who was alleged to have stockpiled multiple stolen weapons and ammunition at a Storm Lake residence taken during burglaries. The suspect was subsequently arrested on federal charges of trafficking stolen weapons.
12. April 2021 – Police were called to a local university for a report of a suspicious package containing multiple marijuana products which was shipped to the university from out of state. After a lengthy investigation police allege an adult student at the university conspired to have the package sent to the university. The student was charged with a felony-controlled substance violation.
13. April 2021 – Police were called to a local hotel parking lot for a report of a fight involving a large group of subjects with handheld weapons and a reported rifle. Police responded and located several subjects fleeing the scene and ultimately charged six juveniles with rioting. A rifle style bb gun was recovered from one of the vehicles.
14. May 2021 – Police were called to a residence for male reported to have been intoxicated a discharged a firearm. After arriving on scene police took the suspect into custody without incident. After an investigation police allege an adult male was intoxicated an attempted to instruct a 9-year-old on how to shoot a rifle, discharging the rifle within the residence. No injuries were reported. The suspect was charged with child endangerment and reckless use of a firearm.
15. June 2021 – Police were called to a local bank for a report of an empty envelope deposited on an account for several thousand dollars. Police launched an investigation and subsequently identified three suspects, charging all three with felony theft.
16. July 2021 – Police were called to BVRMC ER for a victim with serious facial injuries. Following an investigation police recovered evidence and alleged that an adult male suspect had knocked the victim unconscious during a fight, and then continued to hit the male causing serious facial injuries. The male was charged with felony assault.
17. July 2021 – A police officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation. After making contact with the occupants, they detected an odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. A subsequent search warrant on the vehicle yielded 27 pounds of marijuana and approximately \$67,000 cash in the vehicle. Police charged the three occupants on multiple drug charges.
18. August 2021 – Police investigated a report of internal theft from a Storm Lake business totaling over five-thousand dollars in losses. A suspect was charged with fraudulent practice following the investigation.
19. August 2021 – Police were called to a residence for a report of an assault. Police allege that a male suspect was assaulted at the residence and knocked unconscious. After the victim went unconscious, the suspect continued to kick and punch the victim in the facial area causing serious injuries. The suspect was subsequently located and charged with felony assault.

# Highlights Continued

20. August 2021 – Police were called to a report of a recovered stolen vehicle. Police subsequently identified a juvenile male suspect, and also determined the suspect had burglarized multiple vehicles in Storm Lake. The juvenile suspect was charged with operation without owners' consent and multiple counts of burglary.
21. August 2021 – Police received two separate reports of a male suspect on a bicycle who approached females and made lewd comments and conducted inappropriate touching. An investigation was launched, and the case remains under investigation.
22. September 2021 – Police were called to a residence for a report of a male suspect who assaulted a female and then armed himself with a handgun and threatened to kill both of them. The male suspect fled the residence and was located shortly after by police and charged with domestic assault involving a weapon.
23. November 2021 – Police were called to a residence for a out of control male suspect. Police further allege that the suspect had intentionally started a fire in the home with several occupants inside. The suspect was charged with Arson.
24. November 2021 – A suspect was arrested after a several month-long investigations into ongoing burglaries at a storm lake residence. Police found the suspect to have stolen property and multiple packages of methamphetamine on him when placed under arrest.
25. November 2021 – Police were called to a Storm Lake residence for a report a male suspect had struck a female, then armed himself with a rifle and knife and threatened the female and children. The female and children escaped without further harm and the male suspect was taken into custody without incident on assault and child endangerment charges.
26. December 2021 – Police charged a female suspect involving a multi-jurisdictional check forgery incident. The female was charged with multiple counts of forgery and theft.



# Lab Team Activations



- Both the Storm Lake Police and Fire Department have members assigned to the Storm Lake Police Department Clandestine Lab Team. The mission of the Clandestine Lab Team is to identify, process for evidence and eradicate all actual and suspected illegal clandestine drug labs within the City of Storm Lake. The team is also used to assist other jurisdictions under mutual aid agreements.
- The Clandestine Lab Team utilizes specialized equipment to safely accomplish their missions. This equipment includes air monitoring devices, chemical resistant suits, self-contained breathing apparatus, digital video devices.



# Dive Team



The Storm Lake Police and Fire Departments have members assigned to the Buena Vista County Dive Team. Members of the dive team are trained in underwater search and recovery and underwater investigative services.



# Drone

- The SLPD Drone program was formed in 2018 following a series of search/rescue incidents which identified a need for the technology. In 2018 the SLPD purchased and deployed a DJI Phantom 3 drone in conjunction with the launch of the drone program. In 2019, an additional drone, a DJI Mavic Dual equipped with FLIR thermal imaging was purchased and deployed with the program, allowing pilots to conduct night operations.

- The SLPD Drone program consists of three certified pilots, Officer Andrew Allerdings, Officer Alyssa Solem and Assistant Chief Patrick Diekman, who also serves as the program coordinator. Pilots are licensed and certified remote pilots of small unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) through the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Pilots are required to pass an aeronautical knowledge test through the FAA, demonstrating knowledge of safe operations of drones through FAA regulations.

Pilots are required to complete monthly training for preparedness for a variety of scenarios such as:

- Search and Rescue Operations
- Fatality or serious injury accident Investigations
- Crime Scene Documentation
- Damage Assessment
- Disaster Scenes
- Tactical Operations
- HazMat
- Event Security
- Other Incidents as needed




The Storm Lake Police Department has two non-sworn Community Service Officers (CSOs)

Both Community Service Officers are bilingual. They often assist Police Officers in translation, interpretation and community outreach events. They are also responsible for city code enforcement and assist officers with parking enforcement, keys locked in cars, traffic control, vacation house watch and funeral escorts.

# Operation Clean Sweep

Total Contacts by year



- Operation Clean Sweep was designed to utilize the community service officers with the police department to seek out property owners and renters, and educate them to the city's laws on trash, public nuisances, and safety issues. Operation Clean Sweep was designed to be educationally based and speak face-to-face with individuals whose property had violations of city ordinances.
- Operation Clean Sweep is an ongoing program. The program will continue to elevate the quality of life in Storm Lake.
- During 2021, officers contacted 1,043 individuals who had public nuisances on their property. Of the 1,043 people contacted, 1,022 voluntarily cleaned the nuisance. During the 2021 year, 21 people were cited for failing to clean up their property after being shown what the nuisance was.

## SLPD YumVee



- The total cost of the project was nearly \$30,000. We plan to paint lines on the court in the spring of 2022.




# SLPD Coffee Blends


